

3C @ Edify

A Uniquely Designed Curriculum @ Edify-The 3C

"Since there is no single set of abilities throughout human nature, there is no single curriculum which all should undergo rather, the schools should teach everything that anyone is interested in learning"

- John Dewey.

3C is the most innovative and cutting-edge curriculum developed on the framework of essentially primary years program of International Baccalaureate and National Curricular Framework (NCF). This curriculum is designed exclusively for Edify Schools aimed to achieve the desired Character by facilitating and honing the inherent Competencies of a child through the Content-the 3Cs.

The 3C curriculum allows students to be inquirers, where "WHY" is encouraged and "WHAT" is nurtured thus providing students, a truly international curriculum with a focus on international mindedness and strong personal values.

The culture adopted for learning helps to nurture the inquiring minds of children by equipping students with the knowledge, skills, and techniques to address global challenges. Students are encouraged to take responsibility for their learning. The transdisciplinary approach caters to the needs of the individual learning style of the child.

The programme incorporates local and global issues into the curriculum, enabling students to look at six related, transdisciplinary themes and the links between them.

The 3C

Character:

Positive Personality is the key to success in life. Confidence, vivacity and cheerfulness are the most important traits within and can be developed by being generous with praise and making the child responsible towards flora and fauna. We train children to control their behaviour and encourage the development of qualities such as patience, purposefulness, observation, reasoning and logic. Under the guidance, children learn to be independent, patient and decisive. They are taught to reach their goals by dividing difficult tasks into smaller chunks.

Competence:

Proficiency helps in perfection. We develop these qualities through a student centric learning environment by giving them responsibilities, opportunities to explore the society, holding field trips, journaling, preparing group and independent projects and dramas. Sports and Physical Education enables children to self-regulate increasing positive self-talk, goal setting and responsibilities.

Content:

Knowledge gained without implementation has no standing, hence the knowledge gained by the child is practiced in his/her day to day activities. The rich inquiry-based curriculum is a significant and relevant subject matter acquired for the real-life skills and taught through the following subjects, Languages, Mathematics, Science and Technology, Social science, Visual Arts, Music, Drama, Environment Education, Physical, Social and Personal Education.



The focus is on application of knowledge through inquiry, experimentation, research and discovery. In this process they become knowledgeable and understand the significance of the gained knowledge. It is through this constructive learning methodology academic brilliance is inculcated in every child.

Elements of 3C:

There are 6 elements of 3C which encompasses the curriculum in 360 degrees. They are Character, Competence, Content, Knowledge, Concept and Action.

Transdisciplinary themes in 3C

There are 6 Trans-disciplinary themes enabling the children to construct their learning through meaningful everyday life experiences making the entire process of learning more contextual, interesting and definitely more memorable.

1. Our Identity

Learning about the nature of ourselves-our responsibilities, rights and duties, cultural values, and so on knowing about our relationship with friends, family, communities and also what it means to be human.

2. Our Responsibilities

Knowing about the relationship within and between people, other living things and communities. The approach to equal opportunities and conflict resolution. Why human beings should share the natural resources with other living things.

3. Our Expression

How we express our ideas, values, beliefs and culture in multiple ways through different languages and art forms such as dramatics, martial arts, dance, paintings, etc..

4. Place and Time

Learning about oneself in relation to surrounding, place and time. About homes, journeys, discoveries and about inter connection of individuals and different civilizations.

5. World Laws

Knowing about the natural world and its laws. The interconnection between the physical, biological and human society. The impact of science and technology on the society and environment.

6. Our Systems

Gaining knowledge on the interconnection between human made systems and communities.

There are 15 profiles each in core elements of 3C, i.e. Character and Competence.

Character Profiles: Independent, Balance, Responsible, Integrity, Committed, Inquirer, Confident, Courageous, Optimistic, Enthusiastic, Empathetic, Respect for all, Open Minded, Participate and Self Esteemed.

Competence Profiles: Innovative, Proactive, Communicative, Leadership, Adaptable, Organized, Assertive, Passionate, Perseverant, Thinker, Focused, Risk Taker, Decision Maker, Updated and Research Oriented.



Coffee Morning




Pragathi Power Solutions visited Edify and demonstrated the application of solar energy and its uses to students.



















Parent's Voice

HELICOPTER PARENTING

Do you stand over your child's shoulder when they do their homework? Do you find yourself directing your kids' every move? "Pick up this, clean up that, sit up straight, finish your homework, study hard, say thank you." Do you spend a good chunk of your day obsessing about your children's success?

Then no doubt you are a helicopter parent.

A helicopter parent is a parent who pays extremely close attention to a child's or children's experiences and problems, particularly at educational institutions. Helicopter parents are so named because, like helicopters, they "hover overhead", overseeing every aspect of their child's life constantly.

Helicopter parenting can be defined by two types of behaviours that parents exemplify:

- * knowing your children's daily schedule and where they are at all times, helping them make decisions, and being informed about grades and other accomplishments.

- * jumping into conflicts with kids' roommates, friends.

Parents should, of course, do the best they can for their kids. Impulses to involve ourselves in our children's lives often come from a sense of duty, and of unconditional love. We can harness those desires to give the most we can to our kids by resisting helicopter parenting, which can lead to poor outcomes in adulthood.

Instead, try letting your children discover themselves—their weaknesses, strengths, their goals and dreams. You can help them succeed, but you should also let them fail. Teach them how to try again. Learning what failure means, how it feels, and how to bounce back is an important part of becoming independent in our world.

We all want to love our children as much as possible and protect them from the dangers in our society. We live in an increasingly competitive world and want to give our kids every advantage possible. But if we over-parent and smother them, it can backfire big time. A collection of research in recent years shows a connection between helicopter parenting and mental health issues like anxiety and depression as children get older and try to make it on their own.

What we can do to break the helicopter habit?

All parents know that parenting is not easy. Having children and raising them presents innumerable challenges and surprises, but also immense joy and connection. As we know that over parenting only leads to more problems for our kids, we can make the following adjustments in our parenting approach:

- *Support your children's growth and independence by listening to them, and not always pushing your desires on them.

- *Refrain from doing everything for your children (this includes homework!). Take steps to gradually teach them how to accomplish tasks on their own.

- *Don't try to help your children escape consequences for their actions unless you believe those consequences are unfair or life-altering.

- *Don't raise your child to expect to be treated differently than other children.

- *Encourage your children to solve their own problems by asking them to come up with creative solutions.

- *Teach your children to speak up for themselves in a respectful manner.

- *Understand and accept your children's weaknesses and strengths, and help them to use their strengths to achieve their own goals.

*If your children are old enough to do something for themselves, let them and fight the urge to intervene. This can include things as small as tying their shoes, cleaning their room, or picking out their clothes.

*Let children make age-appropriate decisions for themselves. Allow an elementary child to choose their preferred extracurricular activity or hobbies, and let older children choose what classes to take.

*After your child has a disagreement with a friend, co-worker, or boss, don't get in the middle or try to fix it. Teach them skills to resolve the conflict on their own.

*Allow your child to fail. We know this is hard. But not making a team or getting into the college of their choice teaches them how to cope with disappointment.

*Teach them life skills such as cooking, cleaning, laundry, face-to-face interaction, and how to talk with their teachers.

Loosening the reins can be difficult, but this doesn't make you any less of a loving, involved parent. You can show your child that you're always there without solving all of their problems for them.

Rather than focus on the present, think about the possible long-term effects of helicopter parenting. Ask yourself, do I want my child to always rely on me to fix things, or do I want them to develop life skills?

Takeaway

With any parenting style, it's important to consider how it'll affect your child now and in the future.

Of course, every parent at some point has done a little extra to make their child's life easier. The problem is when helicopter parenting becomes a regular thing and hinders healthy development.

If you're "helicopter parent" you may not be aware of it, and there's no doubt you want what's best for your child. So think about the person or the adult you want them to become, and then base your parenting style around this outcome. You may find that stepping back eases a burden — on your shoulders, as well as on theirs.
